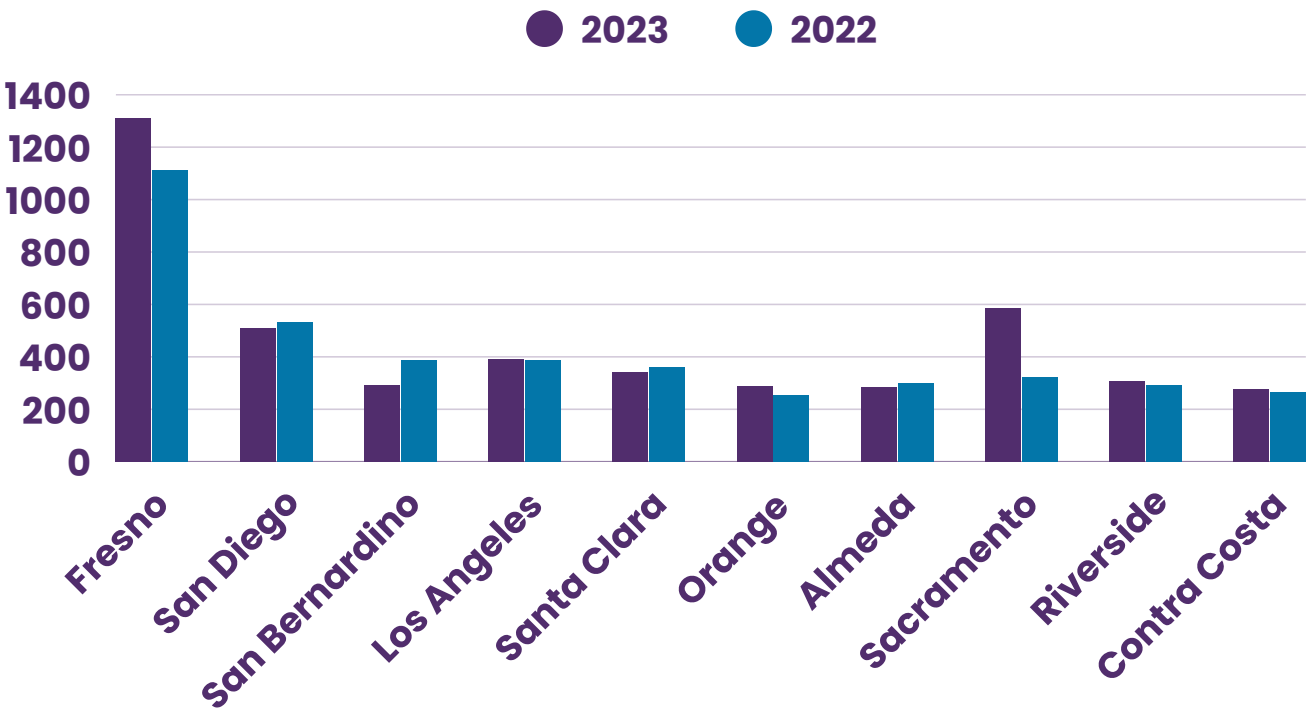

Domestic Violence In Fresno County

Compared to California's 10 largest counties, Fresno County had the highest rate of verified domestic violence calls to law enforcement for help in 2022-2023.

Domestic Violence affects millions of people each year. Nationally, research shows that 1 in 3 women, 1 in 4 men, and 1 in 3 teens will experience domestic violence in their lifetime.

Crisis Response

MMC’s highly trained staff provides comprehensive wraparound services that meet the unique needs of each individual or household—services that begin with our 24/7 helpline and crisis drop-in center.

Every year, MMC delivers critical services to thousands of survivors facing the impossible—and often life-threatening—choice between staying with an abusive partner or becoming homeless. MMC ensures there is always another option, offering survivors and their families a path forward to rebuild their lives.



In the past year alone, law enforcement agencies in the county responded to 13,348 domestic violence calls—an 18% increase from the previous year and a staggering 61% rise over the past two years. Alarming, the severity of reported physical abuse resulting in injury is also on the rise.

The Marjaree Mason Center, as well as local law enforcement, utilize a lethality assessment to assess the level of violence an individual may be experiencing. This includes includes 15 questions that help determine an individual’s level of danger and risk of homicide.

According to the National Institute of Justice, women who score 4 or higher are at great risk (the average score for abused women was just over 3). Currently, the median score for a Marjaree Mason Center client is 10. Our staff remains committed to being here 24/7, 365 days a year.

Safe Housing & Shelter



The Marjaree Mason Center remains the only dedicated provider of safe, confidential emergency shelter and comprehensive domestic violence support services in Fresno County. MMC's Emergency Shelter includes 40 family rooms and 140 beds that are often at capacity.

In addition to meeting the immediate need for emergency shelter, the Marjaree Mason Center offers transitional housing with an additional 56 beds for survivors and their children who continue to look for permanent, affordable housing, on their path towards recovery and long-term self-sufficiency.

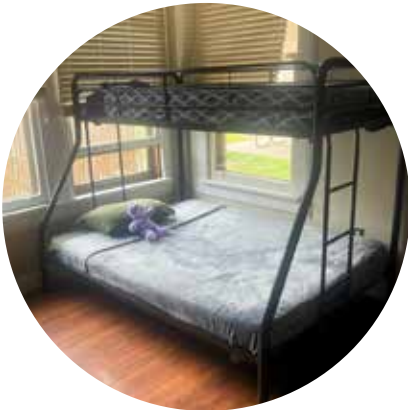

“MMC provided 87,270 nights of emergency and longer-term safe shelter and saw an 16% increase in the length of stay compared to last year.

"I didn't know where to begin when I first entered emergency shelter. But MMC helped me get a restraining order and obtain child custody before moving into one of their transitional housing programs. From there, they continued to help me find work, find childcare for my youngest son, and even helped provide resources for my daughter to pursue a career in healthcare and my son to become a CDL driver. We're now in our own home and self-sufficient - something I never imagined would be possible."



Child Advocacy

The Child Advocacy Program remains a vital part of our response to domestic violence. Children who witness abuse often face lasting emotional and developmental challenges. This year, we strengthened our trauma-informed services, advocacy, and partnerships to ensure these children are supported and not forgotten.

This year, we served 1,129 children, including 249 direct advocacy clients.

Thanks to a key partnership with First 5 Fresno County, we launched a specialized advocacy track for children ages 0-5, offering developmental screenings, caregiver support, and early intervention services after families exit emergency shelter and move into their own homes.

We also strengthened services for children 6 and up, ensuring seamless, age-appropriate care throughout key stages of development.

Expanded home visiting services now allow advocates to meet families where they are—bringing trust, support, and healing directly into the home.



Project ACCESS Collaboration

In partnership with Fresno Unified School District, we referred 79 children experiencing homelessness due to domestic violence to Project ACCESS, which provides school supplies, case management, and academic support—ensuring stability for children facing crisis.



Prevention & Education



During the 2023-2024 school year, we made a meaningful shift in our outreach strategy—transitioning from a club-based approach to delivering classroom-based presentations. We educated over 2,000 middle and high school students through the KNOW MORE® Discussion Guide series.

In addition to offering the KNOW MORE® Program on High School and Middle School campuses, this past year we also expanded our presence on local college campuses, delivering a semester-long series focused on healthy relationships at Reedley College, Coalinga College, and the Firebaugh Center.



IMPACT STORY: Throughout the sessions, many students shared their dating experiences, and a recurring theme emerged: **trust**. Many felt that trust was at the root of many of their issues, whether those were about boundaries, communication, or self-worth.

Another notable shift was the increase in young boys sharing their experiences. Their willingness to be vulnerable signals progress toward more inclusive and emotionally aware dialogue for all genders.

One student shared, “My gf made me share my iCloud information with her so she could see all my messages, calls, and photos. I did not realize that that was her way of controlling me. I didn’t want to share it with her, but I thought this was fine.”

Maternal Health

Through strong partnerships with UCSF–Fresno, Anthem Blue Cross, and the Fresno County Department of Public Health, our Maternal Health Program provides trauma-informed care to expectant and new mothers impacted by domestic violence. We recognize that a healthy start in life begins before birth, and that early, wraparound support can lead to long-term positive outcomes for both mothers and their children. During the 2023–2024 fiscal year, we saw:

52 clients enrolled **16** births **1** set of twins



IMPACT STORY: When Ana arrived at our safe house with her two young children, she was pregnant in her third trimester — fleeing years of abuse. Her 4-year-old son, Mateo, showed signs of trauma—struggling with sleep and separation fears. Ana was quickly connected to our Maternal Health and Child Advocacy teams. She received prenatal education, met with a Public Health Nurse, and attended trauma-informed clinics. Mateo began enrichment activities and play-based support that helped him feel safe again. Soon, he was laughing, playing, and sleeping through the night. Ana gave birth to a healthy baby girl with a plan, supplies, and support in place. She later transitioned into permanent housing, enrolled Mateo in preschool, and began job readiness training.

Community Outreach

The Marjaree Mason Center continues to deepen its community ties by participating in key regional events like **Vintage Days**, **Hmong New Year**, **Pride**, and **Juneteenth**—sharing vital resources and promoting healthy relationships.

We were honored to present at the Federal Correctional Institution in Mendota, reaching **50 inmates** with education on healthy relationships. Many expressed a desire to guide their children away from harmful dynamics—reflecting the impact of our outreach.

We also connected with hundreds at the Central California Women’s Conference and offered our **40-hour domestic violence trainings** in January, June, and September. A specialized session was also held for the Department of Social Services.

Recognizing the needs of rural communities, our team distributed food and resources across the region, ensuring access to support and services for those who need it most.

Counseling

Counseling, both individual and group, is critical for survivors of domestic violence as it provides a safe space to process trauma, rebuild self-esteem, and develop healthy coping strategies.

Counseling services offered by the Marjaree Mason Center allow survivors to explore their unique experiences and emotions in a private setting, fostering personal healing and growth, while also offering a sense of community and shared understanding, reducing isolation and empowering survivors through connection with others who have faced similar challenges.



Family Stabilization Program

The Family Stabilization Program is a collaborative effort between the Marjaree Mason Center and the Fresno County Department of Social Services designed to ensure stability for CalWORKs families impacted by domestic violence. The goal of this program is to increase participants’ success by eliminating barriers interfering with self-sufficiency, stability and independence.

Through intensive case management, counseling, domestic violence classes, children’s supportive services and community resource referrals, clients exhibit improved self-confidence, increased safety and growth toward self-sufficiency. Last year, the Family Stabilization Program served: **217** survivors and their children through **964** case management sessions.

- Make a Qualified Charitable Distribution from your IRA (QCD)**
You may be required to take minimum distributions from your retirement accounts, but a QCD allows individuals aged 70½ or older to donate up to \$100,000 directly from your IRA to organizations like the Marjaree Mason Center. This not only helps us further our mission, but it helps you meet your withdrawal obligation without increasing your taxable income.
- Give a Non-Cash Gift, such as stock or other investments**
If you have appreciated stock or other investments, consider donating them instead of cash. You can avoid capital gains taxes while receiving a charitable deduction for the full market value of the stock.

Combined with Marjaree's Birthday Soirée, and the Men's Leadership Council Golf Classic fundraiser, special events raised more than \$750,000 to support survivors of domestic violence and MMC's mission. The New Home of the Marjaree Mason Center



Where healing begins and courage takes root

For over four decades, the Marjaree Mason Center served the community from a 1913 home in downtown Fresno. It was a place of refuge, where thousands found hope and healing. But as the need for domestic violence services continued to grow, so did our vision. In 2022, we took a major step forward—purchasing a 5.5-acre campus with a 37,680 sq. ft. building that once housed schools like Queen of the Valley, Heald College, and The Milan Institute.

However, significant upgrades were needed in order appropriately modernize the site, meet all applicable building codes and for it to meet all of the needs to serve survivors of domestic violence and operate as a 24/7 trauma-informed facility that's both physically and emotionally safe. And we knew we couldn't do it alone.

Services in this new building include 24/7 crisis response helpline and drop-in center, mental health services for adults and children, a dedicated children's enrichment center, art therapy room, housing and job support, legal advocacy, speech and behavioral therapy room, health clinic, group therapy spaces and a large 100-seat training room.

Including both building acquisition and remodel, the total cost of the project was \$21 million through both public funds and private donors.

In November 2023, we held a public capital campaign launch press conference in which businesses were challenged to get involved and support the project with a \$1 million match incentive over a two week period. At the conclusion of that campaign, \$15 million had been raised, including six gifts of \$1 million or more.

The project then officially broke ground in February 2024. Donors and community partners came together to celebrate and were invited inside the building under demolition to sign the steel beams within what would be the new Crisis Response Suite – or Sanctuary – as it would come to be named.

The Dream Becomes Reality

By the end of the 2024 Fiscal Year, the entire \$21 million campaign goal had been met!
