**Marjaree Mason Center Partners with Community to Raise Awareness of Domestic Violence  
Through “#MakeupFreeforMMC” Social Media Campaign.**

**Fresno, CA (October 3, 2016)** – The Marjaree Mason Center, Fresno County’s only dedicated provider of domestic violence shelter and support services, is launching a social media campaign throughout the month of October in recognition of Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

The #MakeupFreeforMMC initiative was developed by an agency employee, as she noticed that women affected by domestic violence will often cover the signs of physical abuse with makeup, and even cover the emotional, mental and other forms of abuse too by hiding their feelings and making others believe everything is fine. Maybe they feel embarrassed about being a victim of domestic violence, they might think it was a one-time occurrence and the abuser won’t do it again, or perhaps they are worried their abuser will hurt them more if they tell others. Whatever the reason may be, this campaign aims to uncover the abuse, encourage women to be proud of themselves for who they are, spread awareness of domestic violence in our community and let others know about the resources that are available to them, such as the Marjaree Mason Center.

October is National Domestic Violence Awareness Month, and in recognition of that, the Marjaree Mason Center would like to invite all women to participate in their #MakeupFreeforMMC campaign.
